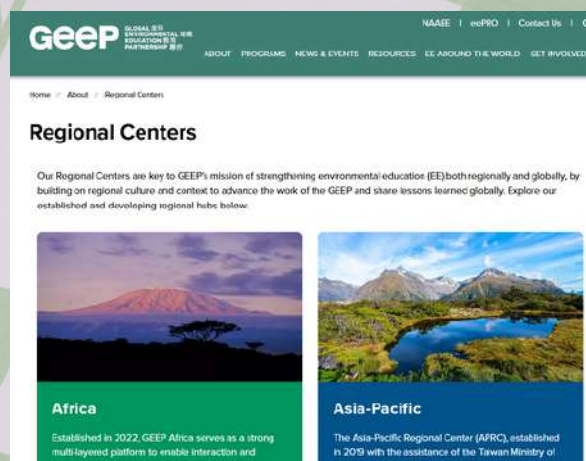
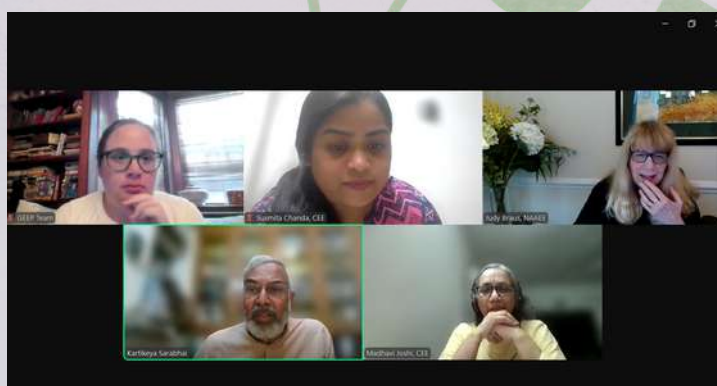

SASEANEE UPDATES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

SASEANEE at UNESCO South Asia Workshop

The ESD-NET Regional Workshop for South Asian Member States, hosted by UNESCO with CEE as the technical partner in New Delhi, focused on advancing Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) for 2030, particularly through greening education systems. Participants mapped national education policies and curricula using UNESCO's guidance under the Greening Education Partnership (GEP) Framework.

Mr. Kartikeya Sarabhai, Director, CEE, addressed the workshop and introduced SASEANEE (South Asia and South East Asia Network for Environmental Education), highlighting the importance of regional collaboration in sustainability education.

The workshop brought together education leaders from the region, including India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Maldives and Sri Lanka, to embed green school standards and climate-focused curricula and to co-develop localized strategies for climate-resilient education systems.

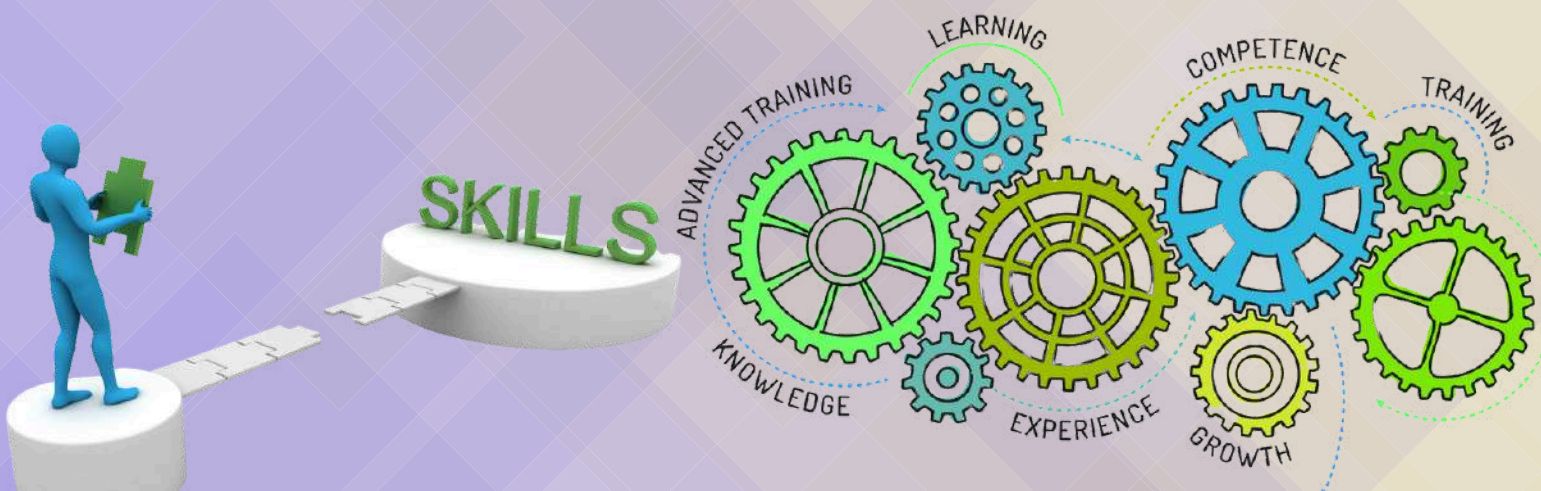

Organized by the Mobius Foundation, the 7th ICSE will be held on 17-18 September 2025 at the India Habitat Centre, New Delhi. The conference focuses on “Sustainability Education for Green Jobs”, emphasizing the need to align education with the green and just transition. It aims to encourage dialogue on integrating sustainability into curricula and workforce skills, preparing learners to thrive in the green economy.

A special session by SASEANEE will focus on Greening Vocational Education, highlighting the role of vocational schools in preparing students for green jobs and driving transformation across sectors. The session will discuss how to embed sustainability competencies into vocational training and teacher education, promoting inclusive and future-ready green employment in South and Southeast Asia.

Event : Make a Difference Week 2025: A Record Year

Make a Difference Week 2025 (MADW), an SER initiative supporting the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration, saw a record participation with 218 events in 42 countries, involving 8,132 volunteers who contributed over 33,000 hours. Together, they planted nearly 70,000 native plants, cleared over 39,000 kg of invasive species, and collected 48,000 kg of waste. SER hosted 24 events, including 11 in Bangladesh and 6 in India, focused on restoration, seed processing, education, and clean-ups.
