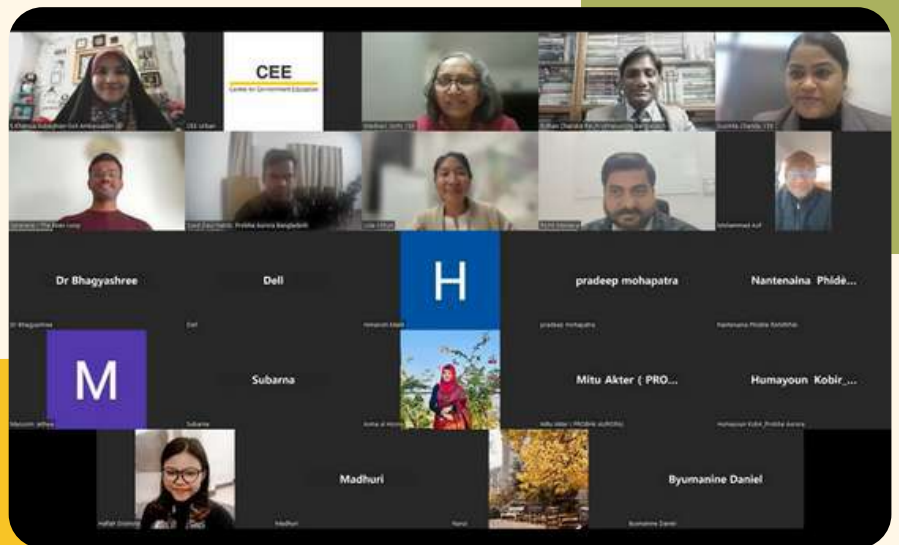

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REGIONAL YOUTH DIALOGUE



SASEANEE hosted an online Regional Dialogue on **Youth Leadership for Sustainable Lifestyles** on January 7, 2026. The discussion focused on sustainability practices, promoting environmental literacy, sustainable agriculture, soil health, and upcycling organic waste. The speakers from the region emphasized on their individual contribution, bringing insights from Indonesia, Cambodia and India.

The session saw an active engagement of participants from 12 countries.

REGIONAL YOUTH DIALOGUE



Ms. Seyyede, a PhD Candidate from the University of Tehran, Iran presented on Sustainable Agriculture and Soil Health ("From Living Soil to Green Living"). She highlighted the importance of soil microbes and noted youth-led initiatives like the "Safe Soil Movement" in India and peatland restoration in Indonesia.

Mr. Saravana Kumaran, founder of Rewise Tech Solutions (India) presented on Upcycling Organic Waste into Climate Conscious Consumer Goods (CCCG).

His company diverts food processing byproducts to create sustainable alternatives. He mentioned Peelz, an initiative to develop homecare products from citrus peels and The Bean Loop using spent coffee grounds.

Ms. Lida Chhun, Sustainability Manager at Six Senses Krabey (Cambodia) discussed Individual Contribution and Operational Sustainability in Hospitality. She stressed the "3Ps" (People, Planet, and Profit) as the framework for sustainability.

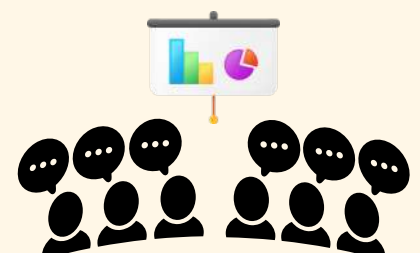
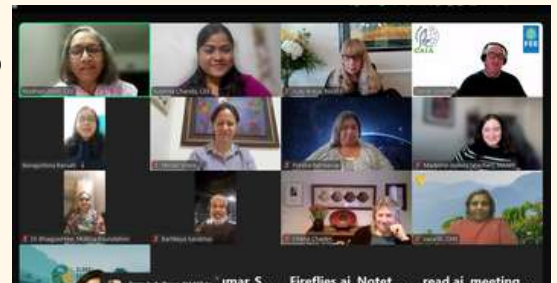

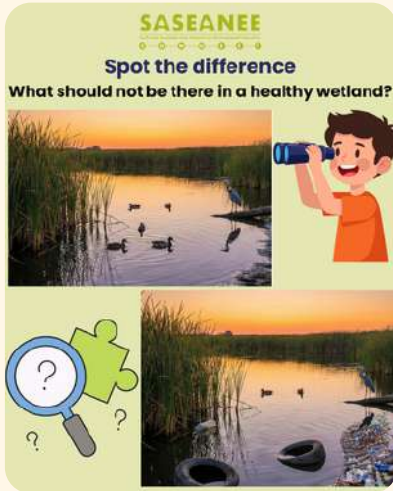
SASEANEE CORE COMMITTEE MEETING

The SASEANEE Core Committee Meeting held on 2 February 2026 reviewed key network updates, including significant membership growth to over 550 members across 29 countries, ongoing regional outreach, and emerging partnership opportunities.

Discussions focused on strengthening youth engagement through initiatives such as EcoSports, advancing the Tbilisi+50 process, expanding nature-based education collaborations, and aligning efforts with major global and regional events. Members also shared updates on upcoming conferences, youth programmes, and international ESD engagements, underscoring the importance of collective action and strategic collaboration in the year ahead.

Climate Catalysts Indonesia, The Wildlife Focus, and SASEANEE collaborated for the Climate Diaries Programme. Climate Diaries envisions empowering youth and educators to create, communicate, and catalyze positive climate action through education, digital engagement, and creative expression.

The collaboration aims to strengthen youth engagement in climate action through storytelling, creative arts, and education, while promoting cross-cultural collaboration and regional visibility for young environmental changemakers. It also supports sustainability education through digital tools and shared learning resources, and amplifies local voices from South and Southeast Asia through the Climate Diaries publication and related campaigns.

Moving beyond textbooks, students actively participate in hands-on restoration—from rehabilitating degraded land to monitoring local biodiversity. This approach shifts environmental education from passive awareness to active agency, equipping young people with the skills to directly combat climate change. By embedding restoration into the "Whole-School Approach," this partnership empowers a new generation of changemakers to halt ecosystem degradation and build a sustainable future.

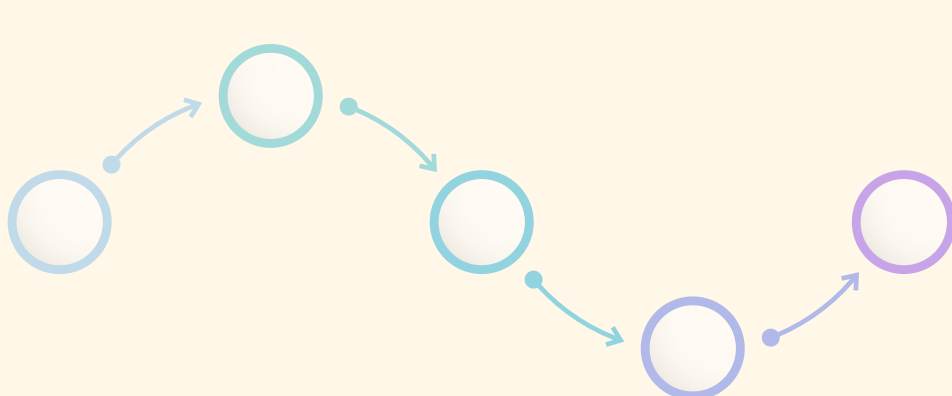

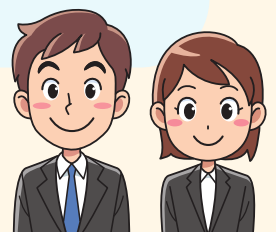

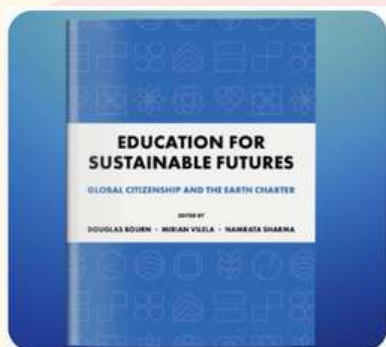
